to the top of the mountain and into a cave.












Thanks to his nose, he moved quickly.

To signal his presence to Andrianina, he made his nose shine.




His nose glowed so bright that light filtered out of the cave and lit up the sky.

He entered and found his friend surrounded by his family.












He delivered them and they hurried out of the cave.















With the help of Varijatsy and his family, Andrianina rescued the poacher.
